Why did we do this?

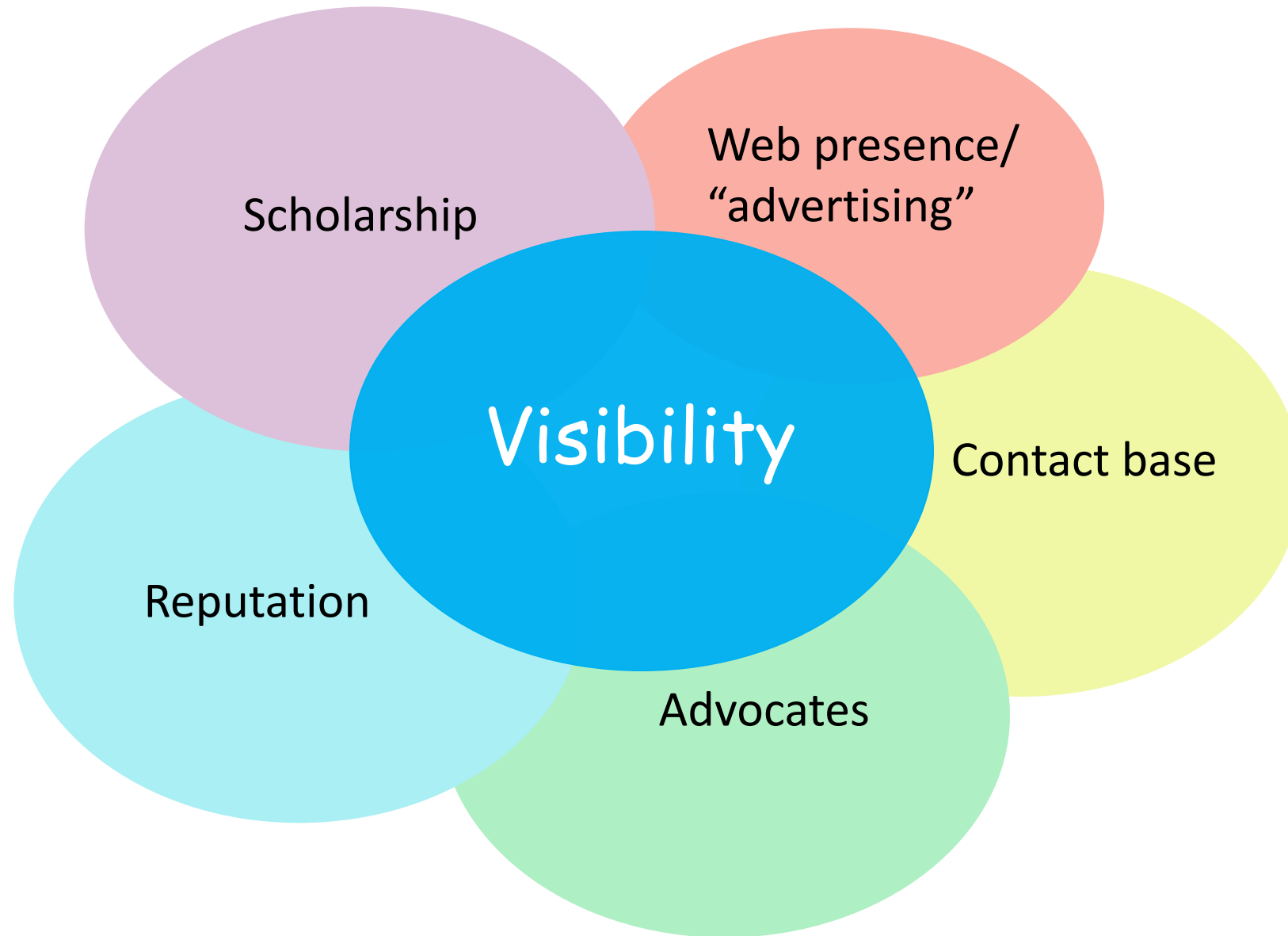
Network is a social activity with a professional purpose.

- Gives different perspectives and diversity of ideas

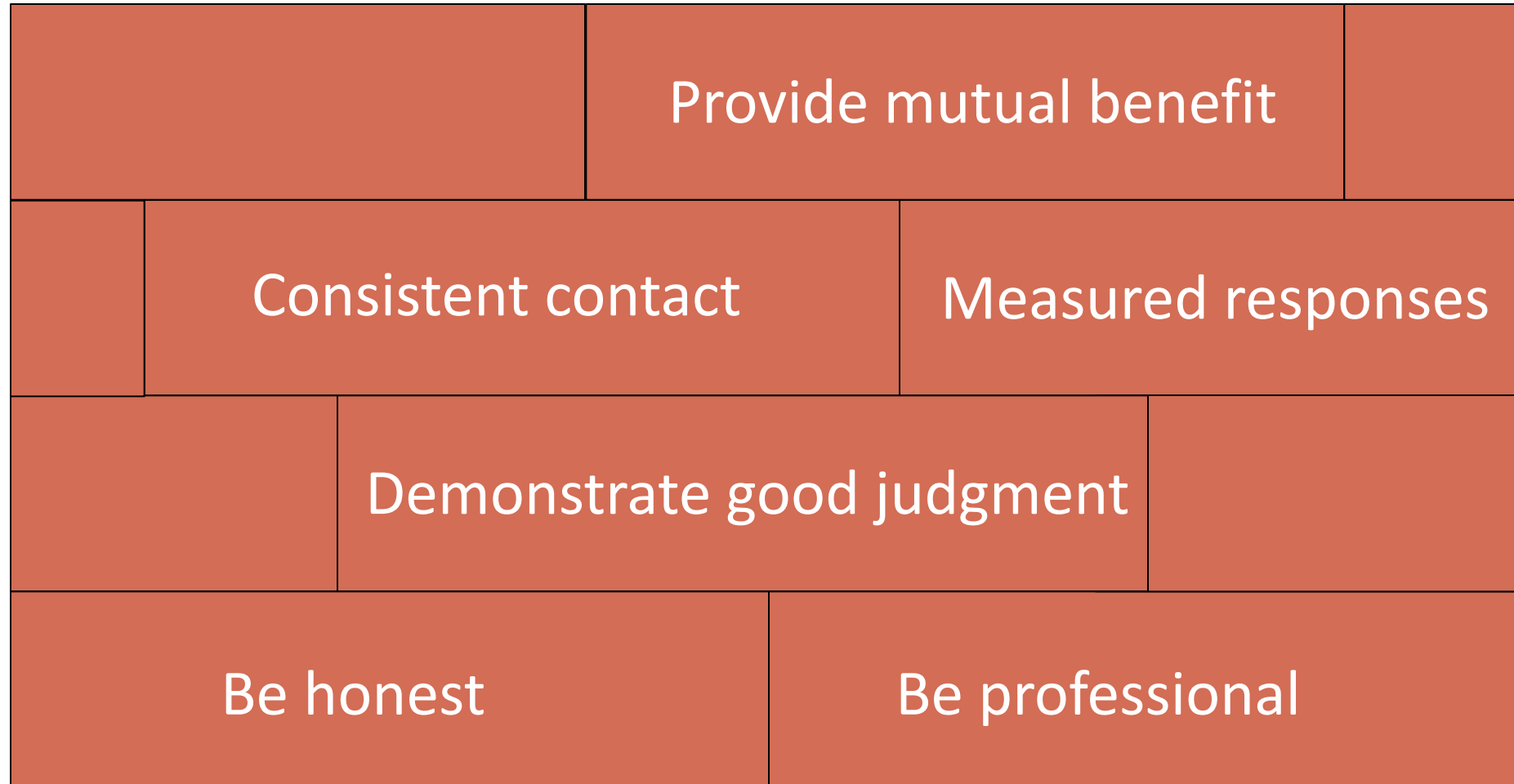

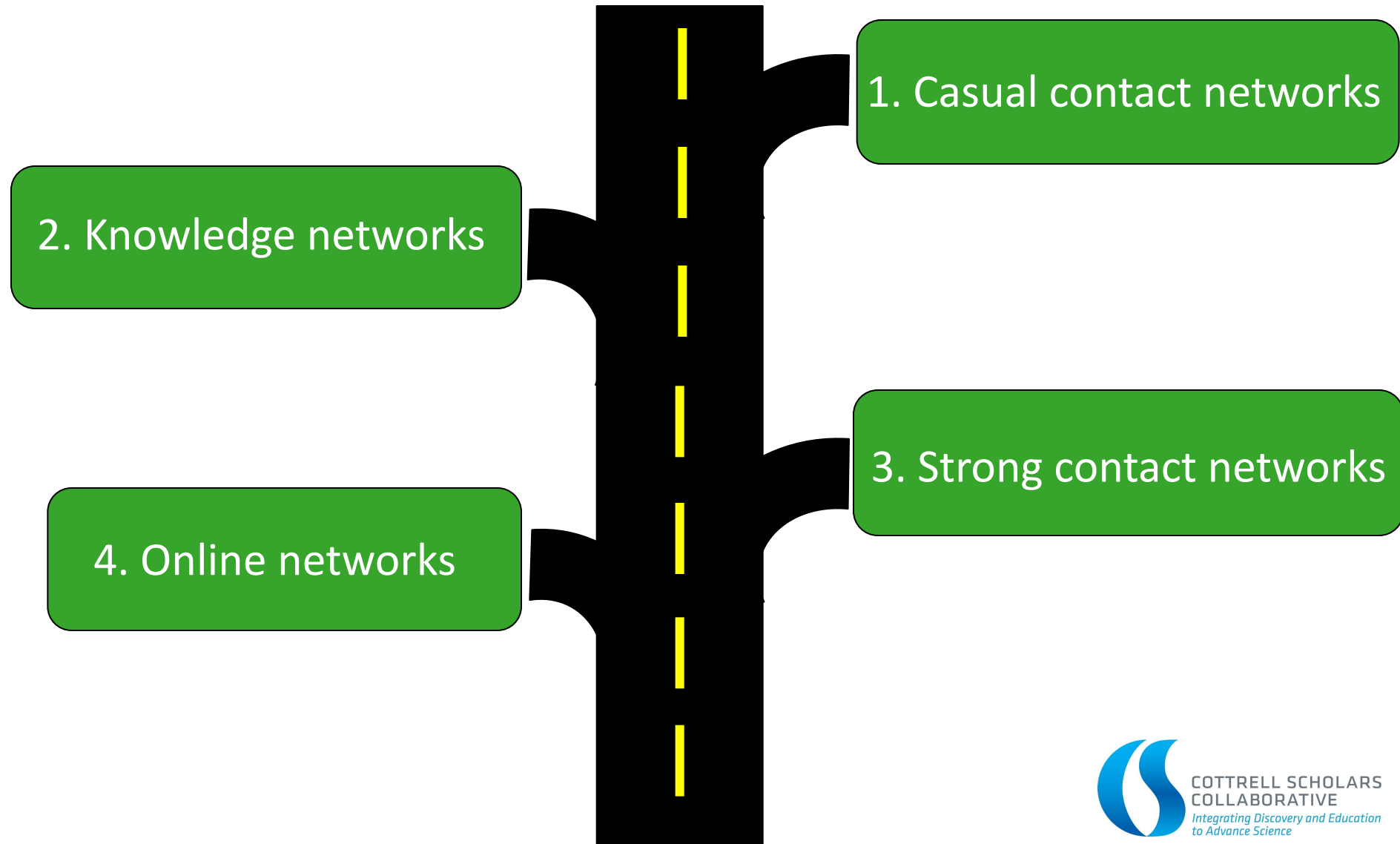
Developing visibility (#1)

Networking activity
